

The Shame of Jesus

Communion Meditation

John 19:23-24

The soldiers therefore, when they had crucified Jesus, took His garments and made four parts, to every soldier a part; and also the coat: now the coat was woven without seam, from the top throughout. They said therefore one to another, "Let us not rend it but cast lots for it, whose it shall be: that the scripture might be fulfilled, which saith, they parted My garments among them, and upon My vesture did they cast lots."

The only possession that Jesus had was the clothing He wore, and when they crucified Him, they even took that away from Him, and Jesus died on the cross, naked. There is enough said about modesty of dress in both Old and New Testaments for us to realize this must have been a great shame to Jesus.

But this act of the soldiers, fits into the scheme of things, when we remember when Adam and Eve ate of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, the first thing they noticed was they were naked. So the Second Adam who died for our sins was made to feel the same shame as the first Adam when he sinned.

Adam and Eve made themselves clothes of fig leaves to cover their nakedness. When God came calling, in the Garden in the cool of the day He said, "Adam where art thou?" Adam said, "I was afraid when I heard thy voice, for I was naked, and I hid myself."

It seems the fig leaf clothes he thought covered his nakedness, was not enough in the eyes of God; he was still naked. In a similar way many of the human race have been persuaded that the fig leaves of their good works is enough to insure their entry into heaven, to stand before God who sees them just as naked as they were the day they were born.

However God provided better clothing for Adam and Eve when he made for them coats of skins, and clothed

them. To be properly clothed before God there had to be the shedding of blood. Paul told the elders of Ephesus: "Take heed unto yourselves, and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit hath made you bishops, to feed the church of the Lord which He purchased with His own blood." The words of the apostle Peter says it like it is when he said in 1st Peter 1:18-19, 'Knowing the ye were redeemed, not with corruptible things, with silver and gold, from your vain manner of life handed down from your fathers; but with precious blood, as of a Lamb without blemish and without spot, even the blood of Christ.'

The blood of Christ is the only thing that covers the nakedness of mortal man in the eyes of God. Galatians 3:27 provides, a very suggestive way as to how we may put on the robes of salvation, when Paul says: "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ did put on Christ." When we are clothed with the blood of Christ, God can no longer see what Isaiah called the filthy rags of our own self-righteousness, but only the sinless perfection of the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world.

In Hebrews 9:22 it is written, "Apart from the shedding of blood there is no remission." In Revelation 1:5 it is written, "Unto Him who loved us and washed away our sins by His sins in His own blood; and made us to be kings and priests unto His God and Father; to Him be the glory and the dominion forever and ever."

THE APPOINTMENT

Communion Meditation

Regarding the institution of the Lord's Supper, in the gospel according to Matthew, Mark, and Luke is the story about Jesus sending Peter and John into the city, and they would see a man bearing a pitcher. Jesus said, "Tell that man that the Master wants to know where, is the room

where I can observe the Passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished, and there make ready for us. In Matthew 26:19 it is written: "And the disciples went, and did as Jesus appointed them."

After the observance of the Last Supper, Jesus instituted the communion service that Paul would call the Lord's Supper. The place of this observance was done by appointment. They did as Jesus appointed them.

Is it not true that we also have an appointment to observe the Lord's Supper on the Lord's Day? Jesus said this do in remembrance of me; and Acts 20:7 indicates that it was the day when the church gathered together for that service. Are we faithful in keeping that appointment?

That is a good question when we consider there are other appointments in the word of God that have been made for us. Paul told the Athenians on Mars Hill: "God hath appointed a day when He will judge the world in righteousness by that man whom He hath ordained, whereof He hath given assurance unto all the nations in that He hath raised Him from the dead." That is an appointment that we all will keep; all other activities will be pre-empted. When I think of that appointment, I feel much better about it, if I am faithful in keeping the appointment at the Lord's Table.

Then there is an appointment in Hebrews 9:27: "It is appointed for man once to die." Whenever I think of that appointment, I really do feel better about it, if I am being faithful to the appointment at the Lord's Table.

There is another appointment in Matthew 28:16: "When the eleven disciples went into Galilee, unto the mountain where Jesus had appointed them." The Great Commission of Jesus to the apostles was given by appointment. This program was to begin at Jerusalem, and from there, to spread to the uttermost part of the earth.

The program of the Great Commission involves every Christian making known the gospel of Christ to every person in the world, either by preaching, teaching, or personal witness; by use of time, talent, or treasure in whatever venue is available. This is our appointed task, and we are reminded of that appointment, when we keep the appointed meeting at the Lord's Table, on the Lord's Day.

Our Ed's sermon translation saw a wonderful baptism we have not experienced before and that is, a cripple given himself to Christ through baptism upon hearing Ed's sermon. He crawls on the ground and lives in a village about two miles away from us. He said he will attend church every Sunday but not on week days. Asking him how he is going to do it, he said he's a farmer and weeds people's farm for a fee so he can manage it to come. Whilst we pity him, he sounds very positive and it gives us a lot of encouragement. We are thinking of getting him a wheelchair. We are going again today after here. Pray for us that we are able to go and get a soul for Christ.

BIBLE STUDY LESSONS

Many are still enrolling and studying the course and we have more lessons to mail back to Ed and Naomi for grading. Quite recently, we had a message from a teacher who is a member of the Bawjiase Church of Christ here in Bawjiase but teaches in a village that, his students are not good at all in English so he is using the lessons to teach them the English language. THE DEVIL'S DAMNATION SCALE

Temptation is like music. The scale of music and the scale of sin are both in very narrow confines. All music is composed within the confines of the scale A, B. C. D. E. F. G. All music composed by Brahms, Beethoven, Bach, Berlin, or Bousman, was comprised of those notes—no more no less. Even the noise we hear on radio and television that is called music has no more than these same notes. Sometimes sharps and flats are slipped in between the cracks of those notes, but that is all there is to the scale of music. There seems to be no limit to the number of songs that can be composed of such narrow confines.

The scale of sin is in more narrow confines than music. The Devil's Damnation Scale is composed of only three notes. John tells us what the sin scale is in his first epistle the second chapter and the sixteenth verse, "FOR ALL THAT IS OF THE WORLD, THE LUST OF THE FLESH AND THE LUST OF THE EYES AND THE VAINGLORY OF LIFE, is not the Father, but of the world."

This is the scale the Devil used in his siren song to Eve and then to Adam in the Garden of Eden. It worked so well that he has used it successfully on everyone else since. The Devil only has three strings on his damnation banjo, three notes to play on his damnation trumpet. He may play sharps and flats. He is a master of harmony, but it is always the same three notes.

Sometimes people say that young people have greater

temptations than fifty years ago. No! There are no new temptations. The harmony may be arranged differently, but there is no end of songs the Devil can play on the damnation scale—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes and the vainglory of life, all that is in the world, is in this damnation scale. PAUL THE OBNOXIOUS

A casual reading of Paul's epistles, especially to the Corinthians reveals that he was a very undesirable person. In fact he was very obnoxious. Consider the following statements he made about himself.

In Second Corinthians 12:16, He indicated that he was sneaky. He said, "Never-the-less, being crafty, I caught you with guile."

In the eleventh chapter of the same book he confessed to being a thief of the worst kind. In verse eight he said, "I robbed other churches." Notice he did not rob banks he robbed other churches. How despicable can a person get? In the same chapter in the tenth verse he indicates that he was a braggart. He said, "No man shall stop me of this boasting." Now think of that, a man who goes around robbing Churches and then brags about it.

Then again in the same chapter in the sixth verse he indicates that he is lacking in social graces of polite behavior. He says, "But though I be rude in speech..." Think of that he was rude to people and admitted it.

And to cap the climax, on top of all that he was very narrow minded, dogmatic, and intolerant. He was in favor of everybody going to hell if they did not agree with him. In Galatians the first chapter and ninth verse he said, "If any man preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed."

Most religious people today would agree with the Jews in Jerusalem when they said in Acts 22:22, "Away with such fellow from the earth, for it is not fit that he should live." E.B.
