TWO COMMUNION

September 2010

John 11:56 What think ye? That He will not come to the feast? After the resurrection of Lazarus the chief priest decide to kill Jesus. Jesus withdrew into the country to await the moment when it could be said His hour had come. When the time for the final Passover had come many of the Jews went to Jerusalem to purify themselves. As they waited for the big day they began to look for Jesus. It was then that they asked that question. What think ye that He will not come to the feast?

There was nothing more certain than the fact that Jesus would be there for this Passover. He had been present at the institution of the first Passover in the book of Exodus. It was there that the Israelites were told to slay a lamb for each family and strike the blood on the side posts and the upper doorpost of each home. God said, "I will passover the land and slay the first born of every family in Egypt and when I see the blood I will passover you."

Now the time has come when the last Passover will take place. That is why that Passover is called the Last Supper. So the question was asked. What think ye that He will not come to the feast? There was no way Jesus would miss that feast. He Himself was to be the Lamb that was slain for the sins of the world.

After He observed that feast in preparation for the slaying of the Lamb of God, it was at that time that He instituted the Lord's Supper. He has commanded the Christians to observe that memorial feast remembering that when the Lord returns in judgment, He will see the blood on the door of the Church of Christ and Passover them.

So it is still a good question. Every week as we look forward to the coming of the Lord's Day we cannot help but wonder about a great percentage of the membership of our congregation; "What think ye, that they will not come to the feast?" It is a sad situation. Many will not come to the feast for the celebration of the slaying of the Lamb of God who died to save us. There is no way the Lord Jesus Christ would let any thing keep Him from the attendance at the feast. What think ye that He will not come to the feast? All things are ready come to the feast! Come for the table now is spread; Ye famishing, ye weary come, and thou shalt be richly fed.

THIS DO IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME

Regarding the Lord's Supper Jesus said, "This do in remembrance of Me." We are told that the church that was established on the Day of Pentecost continued steadfastly in the Apostles doctrine, in fellowship, in the breaking of bread and the prayers. In Acts 20 Luke tells us, "And upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight." The practice of the Church at Troas serves as a precedent for us today. Under the oversight of an inspired Apostle the Church observed the Lord's Supper every first day of the week. They did not come to hear this ace of apostles, this prince of preachers, this dauntless disciple, this peerless prophet; they came for the purpose of observing the feast.

Over 100,000 Sundays have passed by since the day the Church began. The Lord's Supper has been observed on every one of those Sundays and will continue to be observed on every Sunday until that day when the trumpet sounds announcing the Lord's return. The Lord's Supper is a continual reminder to the Christian that Jesus died to save us. Jesus said, "Whosoever shall confess Me before men I will confess before the Father who is in heaven." The Lord's Supper is an opportunity to re-confess that Jesus is the Christ the Son of the living God.

If the President of our country would send you an invitation to dine with him at the White House on the occasion of his birthday; RSVP, I wonder how many would respond by telling him: "Sorry Mister President, I can't make it, that's my bowling night." Ladies and Gentlemen, as a Christian you have a personal invitation from the King of kings and the Lord of lords to be present to observe the feast of the Lord's Supper; not in remembrance of His birth, but in remembrance of His death. We celebrate the birth of men like, Washington, Lincoln, and King, but with Jesus it is His death that we celebrate. Nothing is said in scripture about observing His birth. It is His death we celebrate. This do in remembrance of Me.

For these 11 souls that were baptized to remain faithful, The Truth shall be holding a weekly Bible Lessons for them.

OTHER CONGREGATIONS: The Fianko, Agona Nkwanta, Adawukwao, Ofadaa and the Awutu Ofaakor churches are all doing well by the grace of God, not forgetting Park Side (where we worship) and also our weekly Bible Classes at Danso, and two other villages. We thank all of you for the materials for the work here which are helping a lot in the promotion of the Gospel here. Please,
