# A TIN HORN CHRISTMAS

The Christmas season gives us pause as we reflect on Christmas's past. As a child my mother used to say the best Christmas we ever had was the year I got the electric train. I remember the electric train and I also remember that I was too young to understand how to work it. I recall that Dad was the one who played with it while I watched in wonder as it ran around the track.

I also remember another Christmas when we were not so prosperous. It was the Tin Horn Christmas. During the depths of the great depression, I was standing on the front porch and Dad came home and before going in the house he handed me a tin horn. In fact he had three tin horns that cost ten cents a piece. One tin horn was for me, one for my sister, and one for my brother. Dad announced that times were hard and this was all he could afford and since I was the oldest I would understand. He was probably so depressed by his financial situation that he had not bothered to wrap them up and then again he more than likely could not afford wrapping paper.

In retrospect, I often think of this when we spend several hundred dollars on the grandchildren at Christmas time now. The thought that is in my mind is-would Amanda, Casey, and Emily understand if I told them the best

Christmas I ever had was the Christmas of 1930. Should they ask why; I would tell them-That is the year that I had received a very valuable Christmas gift-a little tin horn that cost ten cents. E.B.

# FROM THE CRADLE TO THE CROSS

Jesus was born in Bethlehem and crucified at Jerusalem. The distance between the two is only eight miles. Eight miles between the cradle and the cross. Eight miles between the first birth at Bethlehem in the manger, and the second birth from the tomb of Joseph. Some folk spell Christmas by dropping Christ and spelling it Xmas. Actually Xmas gives the spelling the sign of the cross. Xmas may be more appropriate than some think. You cannot think of Xmas at Bethlehem without thinking of the cross at Jerusalem.

The news anchor on the eleven o'clock news several years ago in Cincinnati told of a woman and her small daughter who were looking at the display of the shepherds in their visit to the manger in a department store window. The child asked her mother what it meant. The mother said, "It means Mary had a little baby." The child said more than the newsman or the mother realized. Mary did have a little Lamb-it was the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world. Actually the similarity is quite obvious when you consider that it is only eight miles from Bethlehem to Jerusalem. Only eight miles from the cradle to the cross. E.B.

# DO IT ALL FOR JESUS

In Colossians 3:17 Paul tells us, "Whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by Him." This is a short rule that covers the whole spectrum of the Christian life. Try it on for size-of course, we were baptized for the remission of sins in the name of Jesus Christ (by His authority). After this, everything else is to be done in His name also, and not only done in His name, but we are to give thanks to God and the Father by Him. Here are a few things we could mention. Perhaps you can add to the list:

- \* Miss the Lord's Supper some Lord's Day and when you do, do it in the name of the Lord Jesus.
- \* Tell a dirty joke to someone today and when you do, do it in the name of the Lord Jesus.
- \* Drink a few beers and when you do, do it in the name of the Lord Jesus.
- \* Smoke a cigar and when you do, do it in the name of the Lord Jesus.
- \* Stay home from Church all you able-bodied Christians and look at television and when you do, do it in the name of the Jesus.
- \* Go see a dirty movie and do it in the name of the Lord Iesus
- \* Read a Pornographic magazine and when you do, do it in the name of the Lord Jesus.
- \* Spread a few rumors in the name of the Lord Jesus.
- \* The next time you get upset with someone, tell them to go to hell in the name of the Lord Jesus.

- \* Stay away from the revival in the name of the Lord Jesus.
- \* Miss prayer meeting in the name of the Lord Jesus.
- \* Commit adultery in the name of the Lord Jesus.
- \* Play the horses in the name of the Lord Jesus.

Above are some things you can do in the name of the Lord Jesus. Now that I have stimulated your thinking, maybe you can add to the list. Remember that Paul tells us, "Whatsoever we do in word or deed, do in the name of the Lord Jesus and give thanks to God and The Father by Him." E.B.

#### UNDER THE TREE

December the twenty-fifth is the day we set aside to celebrate the birthday of the Lord. It should not be necessary, but it needs to be pointed out that we don't know what day the Lord was born. He didn't tell us in His word, but He was born and it might as well have been December the twenty-fifth as any other day of the year. People usually get gifts on their birthday so we need to give the Lord a gift on His birthday. Then there is an additional element when we think of Christmas - there is the matter of the tree. If you are going to give a gift to the Lord on His birthday, put the present under the tree. Put it under the tree that Peter talked about in Acts the fifth chapter: "Whom also they slew hanging Him on a tree." Paul said in Galatians the third chapter in speaking of the crucifixion, "Cursed is everyone that hangeth on a tree." You see, the real Tree is the CROSS. Personally I can think of no better way to celebrate the birthday of the Lord than by placing a generous gift at the foot of the cross. Sending that check to the GOD IS JUST A PRAYER AWAY radio broadcast is one way to put your present under the tree, and know exactly where it's going, because you can listen every Sunday.
