
The third Sunday of November marks another mile stone, in the ongoing of the "God Is Just A Prayer Away" radio broadcast. On that date the fifty-third years begins. It was 1962 when this concept of reaching people by radio started. Instead of a program on several small stations, why not put a program on one of the big 50,000 watt AM outlets. There was at the time only 75 of these stations in the United States out of over 9,000 other radio stations both FM and AM. Because of their great power the signal of some of these stations reach out to about twenty-six states. For example only one of these stations is in Kentucky, three in Ohio, one in Virginia. Some states don't have any. Some of the large cities like New York, and Chicago may have several. Because of their great power the price of putting on a program on these stations takes much more money, but one of these programs covers more area than dozens of smaller powered outlets. This may or may not be the best way to do it, but it was our concept at that time. Some idea of how far the eleven 50,000 watt broadcasts is heard at this time is shown in the number of states reached each week. Letters from Montana to Florida, Kansas to Maine, Texas to Michigan, New York to California and Nevada and Mexico to at least six provinces of Canada, the West Indies, and sometimes from freighters in the Atlantic Ocean.



In September 1997, we started on Shortwave Radio—Bible Voice Europe, reaching all countries throughout Europe including Russia. In November 1997 he began Shortwave Radio Africa reaching over 140 million English-speaking people in three former British Colonies: Nigeria, Ghana and Cameroons. In June 1999 we started broadcasting in to India by the superpower Radio Sri Lankóthe Giant of Asia. This shortwave broadcast reaches India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Afghanistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka and the local language is English reaching out to over one billion. April 2003 we begin broadcasting into Western Russia, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Ukraine, Czech Republic and Bulgaria by means of the powerful 100,000 watt transmitter—Bible Voice Russia.

The program is supported in finances by less than 400 persons, and 78 congregations. Just wanted you to know that we have been doing this thing for fifty-two years and that the fifty-third year will begin on the third Sunday of this month. Truly God is able to bring things about which we think are impossible. (Revised 2014)

A ROYAL INTRODUCTION
